The Court of Justice of the European Union considers that any charge, whatever it is called or however it is applied, 'which, if imposed upon a product imported from a Member State to the exclusion of a similar domestic product has, by altering its price, the same effect upon the free movement of products as a customs duty', may be regarded as a charge having equivalent effect, regardless of its nature or form (Joined cases 2/62 and 3/62, and Case 232/78).
